Activities Volunteer

Newbury



Can you make a cup of hot chocolate? Or kick a football? Or help paint nails? Or help young people with job applications? Or just be willing to spend time with young people? Then you could be an ideal volunteer for one of the oldest youth charities in the world.

They run a range of activities for local young people aged 11-25 years including football sessions, pop up youth café, job club for young adults, mentoring sessions for young people and 11 a side men's Saturday football. You will need to be energetic, but have a calm, patient and caring nature. Good communication and non-judgemental listening skills are essential. **(Ref: NY1425)**

Activities Volunteers

Newbury



A Newbury-based charity supports people of all abilities and disabilities to achieve, engage and have fun. The charity runs a number of activities throughout the week, and volunteers are required to help with the facilitation of the sessions. Activities include dance, drama, singing, music, film, computing and living skills.

No special skills are needed, just punctuality and a caring attitude. The charity offers a supportive environment for volunteers, who are encouraged to learn skills and share their experiences with others. **(Ref: NY1154)**

An organisation which provides residential care for elderly people is looking for volunteers to help make their residents feel less isolated.

Can you make cards, knit, dance or are you able to listen and talk? You can volunteer for just a few hours to help with an activity, and it does not have to be every week. Some residents are housebound and would love to see a new face. **(Ref Newbury: NY1359, Ref Thattham: NY1358)**

Cold Ash



Cold Ash is home to an activities centre owned by the Guide Association, and the facilities are used by both the organisation and other groups that work with young people.

None of the activities could take place without the support of enthusiastic volunteer instructors, willing to share an interest in leisure pursuits such as climbing, low ropes, abseiling or archery. Activities are usually run in the spring and summer months, and volunteers will need to have an appropriate qualification in the activity they lead. **(Ref: NY1234)**

Administrative Assistant

Theale



A Theale based organisation that supports people with disabilities is looking for a volunteer to provide administrative support in its office.

Activities will include typing up minutes, researching useful contacts, inputting information into spreadsheets, writing some reports and helping with volunteer recruitment procedures.

The role would suit a volunteer with good knowledge of Microsoft Office packages who enjoys being part of a team. Time commitment is one day a week, with times flexible to suit you. **(Ref: NY1839)**

Administrator and Fundraiser

A local service which supports those who have experienced domestic abuse is seeking an admin volunteer to help with tasks such as paperwork, data entry, organising electronic files and photocopying. Fundraising is in a development phase and as such, you could also bring more resources to this area.

This is an excellent opportunity for someone who would like to assist within the domestic abuse field but may not wish to have direct contact with victims. Time commitment is at least one morning or afternoon a week, ideally for at least a year. **(Ref: NY1693)**

A local service that supports people experiencing difficulties with alcohol and drug use is seeking a volunteer to provide admin/reception support to its team.

The role would suit a volunteer with good writing, communication and computing skills who can work confidently with Microsoft programs. Days and hours can be flexible to suit your volunteering needs – a day or half day a week would be ideal. **(Ref: NY1795)**

Do you have military experience or knowledge, as well as a passion to teach young people vital life skills? You could help a cadet group that meets in Thatcham on Tuesday evenings, offering young people aged 8-16 the chance to take part in military style training, together with sport and adventure activities.

If you have a kind nature and the drive to inspire young people as they develop the skills they need to become good citizens, then they would love to hear from you. There would also be the opportunity to get involved with occasional weekend trips. **(Ref: NY1235)**

Advertising Coordinator

Are you a good communicator with a few hours to spare each month? The local branch of a national charity which supports parents is looking for a volunteer Advertising Coordinator. The role involves helping the branch raise funds by contacting local businesses about advertising and sponsorship opportunities, for example through their newsletter.

Time commitment is a few hours a month, with more input at certain times, for example when the newsletter is being produced. If you have enthusiasm and initiative, you could help boost fundraising income. **(Ref: NY1056)**

A charity which offers advocacy to older people, carers and people with disabilities or long-term illness is looking for a volunteer to promote its services in West Berkshire.

As an advocacy champion, you will visit local groups and events to talk about and promote the charity's services. As such, this role requires a good communicator with an interest in empowering those who may be disadvantaged. Time commitment is one to two days a week. **(Ref: NY1681)**

Could you help a vulnerable young person to have their voice heard, for example during meetings and reviews? A charity is recruiting volunteer advocates in West Berkshire, in a role that is independent to social services.

As an advocate, you would meet with a young person to find out what they would like said at a meeting, and then attend the meeting itself to present their views. Full training and supervision are provided, and volunteers need to be aged 21+. **(Ref: NY638)**

Advocates come from all walks of life and each brings with them individual life experiences and expertise. Many citizen advocates have had no significant involvement with people with disabilities before. Many have found that their long term commitment to a person with disabilities can be a powerful force in that person's life. Advocacy relationships can positively affect the way that a person with disabilities is valued and respected in their community.

Volunteers are being recruited to train as advocates to support adults with learning disabilities in West Berkshire. **(Ref: NY640)**

Ageing Creatively Volunteer

Are you passionate about both older people and the arts? A local arts organisation has recently launched a creative programme for people over 55 in West Berkshire, and volunteers are required to help support the sessions.

The sessions explore creative ways for participants to engage in the arts, covering areas as poetry, visual arts and singing. As a volunteer, your role would involve assisting in preparing the room and resources, engaging participants and providing one-to-one support.

The sessions take place on weekdays, and time commitment is one and a half to two hours a week depending on the project. **(Ref: NY1821)**

They are there to ensure the person understands their rights, police procedures, and to safeguard their welfare whilst in custody.

Could you undertake this role? Volunteer Appropriate Adults are being recruited to cover the local area. Volunteers will need to be non-judgemental, and have the confidence to deal with challenging situations. Full induction and training will be provided, as well as opportunities to shadow existing volunteers. **(Ref: NY1854)**

Do you have proven artistic and creative skills? A local visitor attraction which houses over 600 species of plants and animals is looking for an artistic volunteer to undertake a variety of creative projects, such as improving public areas, animal enclosures and displays.

These visits can be made at a time suitable for the volunteer and the borrower. You will need access to your own car (a mileage allowance will be paid).

Befrienders visit for one to two hours a week, to chat, watch television, listen to music or read a book. They may also take the young person out for a walk. The role would be suited to friendly volunteers with good listening skills and a willingness to learn. Training will be provided. **(Ref: NY1756)**

A local organisation, operating from Newbury town, provides support, friendship and guidance to people who have been affected by mental health conditions. Volunteers are needed to meet, chat and give support to the group's members, as well as partake in activities. If a volunteer has particular skills, they may be able to lead workshops for small groups of members (for example, walking or crafts).

Members drop in at different times during the day, and volunteers are needed from Monday to Thursday. An ability to empathise is essential, and volunteers who have experienced mental health issues themselves would be particularly welcome. **(Ref: NY756)**

A charity that supports adults with physical disabilities across West Berkshire is looking for volunteers willing to share time and a hobby or interest as a one-to-one befriender. You could help someone with a disability maintain a social life and enjoy leisure activities such as swimming, walking, music, shopping or simply a chat and a coffee! They will match you up with someone with a common interest.

Ideal if you have patience, a sense of humour, your own transport and would like to experience the rewards of sharing an interest with others. **(Ref: NY1245)**

A befriending service in West Berkshire helps make a difference to the lives of specialist palliative care patients with life limited illnesses and their carers.

Befrienders will be trained to enhance the quality of patients' lives by supporting and promoting their welfare. This could include offering companionship, sharing activities and escorting. Volunteers will need to be able to offer a commitment of one to two hours a week. Individuals need to be good communicators and have a warm, friendly nature. **(Ref: NY866)**

We all experience loneliness at some point in our lives, so imagine how it must feel to be lonely every day. This is a particular problem for older people who can become lonely for many reasons. Having regular interactions with other people has been proven to combat loneliness, which is why Volunteer Centre West Berkshire are recruiting volunteers to become befrienders for lonely people aged over 50 who live in West Berkshire.

Once trained, you will be carefully matched to someone you will connect with, then just like a friend, your role will be to take a little time to visit once a week or so to have a chat and enjoy each other's company. **(Ref: NY1700)**
